
Definition

Economic Development is a long-term endeavor to create conditions for economic growth and improved quality of life by expanding capacity of individuals, firms and communities to use talents and skills to support innovation, lower transaction costs, and responsibly produce and trade valuable goods and services.

Numbers at a Glance

- Between 2007-2012 minority owned businesses in NH grew by 26.3%"
- Immigrants are 6% of the state's population, 7% of the workforce and 8% of entrepreneurs^{iv}
- NH has the highest median income in the country, but it varies greatly, with white Granite Staters making \$11,500 to \$19,000 more than those of other racial and ethnic backgrounds."

Unemployment Disproportionately Affects People of Color in NHⁱⁱ



American Community Survey, 5 year estimates 2011-2015 Workforce participation rates (the percent of the population engaged in working or job seeking) are essentially the same across races and ethnicities in NH, with 68% of the working age population active in the workforce. However, the rate of unemployment (inability to find work) disproportionately

affects people of color.

Case Example

Entrepreneurs of color often face barriers in accessing credit to start their own business. Microlending "fills the gap and provides opportunities toward economic development like creating jobs and generating taxes. Mircrolending programs provide coaching to new American emerging entrepreneurs, supporting them to become productive citizens of the U.S.," said Tika Acharya, a new American and NH small business owner.

Arriving with his family from Bhutan in New Hampshire in 2009, Tika became a U.S. citizen in 2014. The Regional Economic Development Center (REDC) offered Tika financial and technical assistance and a microloan to help his business, AS Insurance, grow. Tika is using the knowledge he has gained to help other new Americans reach their entrepreneurial goals.

In partnership with the Welcoming Concord Initiative, REDC is offering the Greater Concord Community Microloan Program, with the purpose of encouraging business development and job creation for new Americans and ambitious entrepreneurs based in Concord and the surrounding communities.
